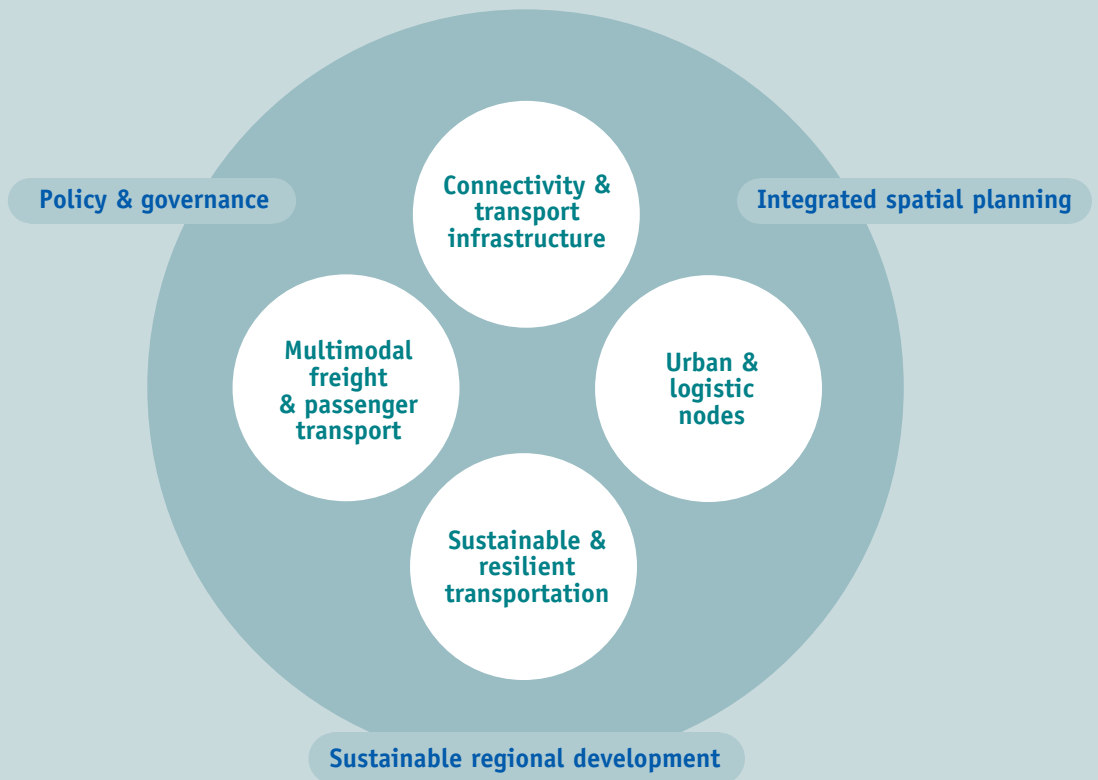

new and innovative solutions.

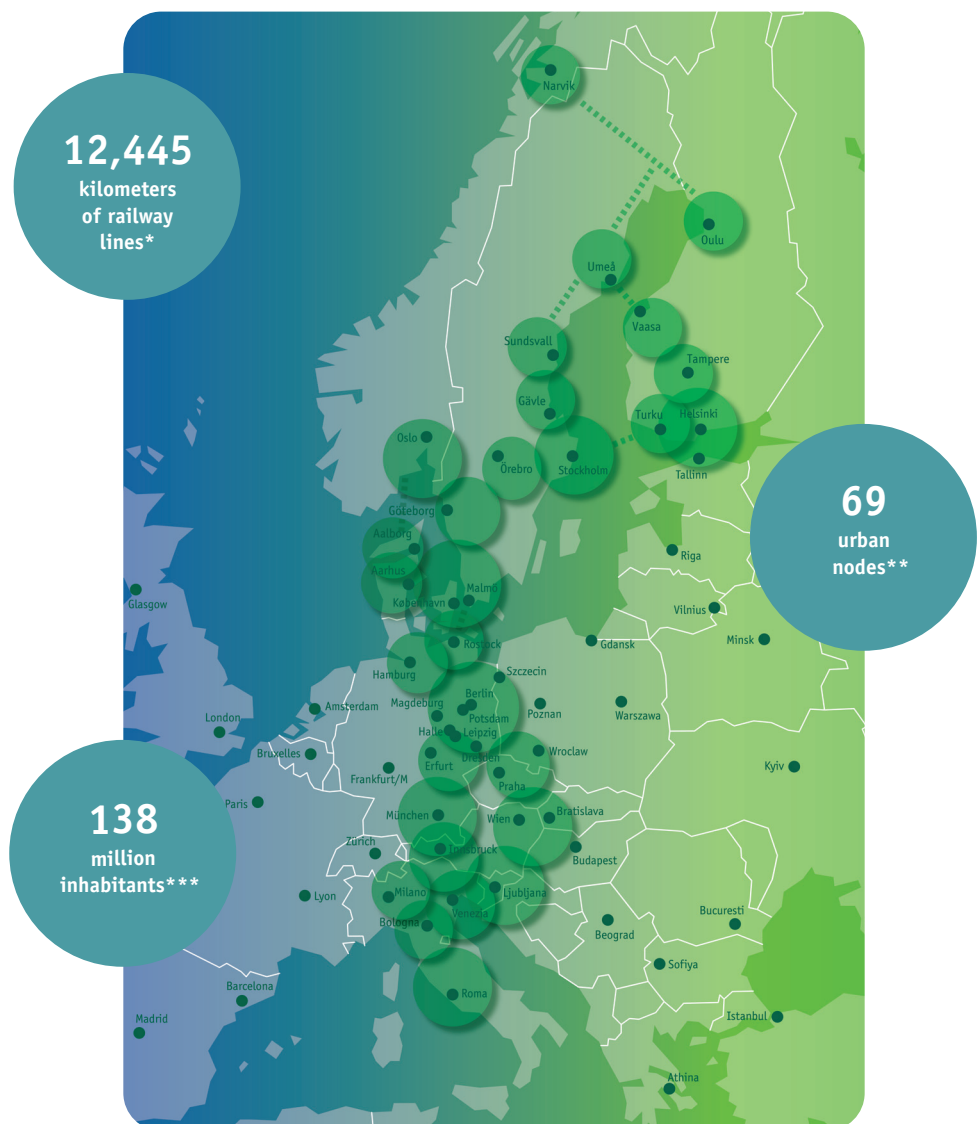


The Scandria Corridor

The Scandria Alliance represents cities, regions and further stakeholders along the Scandria Corridor.

Scandria stands for Scandinavian-Adriatic. To a large extent, the Scandria Corridor is coherent with the Scandinavian-Mediterranean (ScanMed) European Transport Corridor.

The Scandria Corridor has been initiated by Eastern German federal states in the early 2000s with the aim to strengthen a development axis connecting Northern and Southern Europe along the former iron curtain.
